Background

The key populations (KP) drive the HIV epidemic in Asia and the Pacific. However, the available data suggest that the epidemic is shifting towards young key populations (YKP). YKP include young drug users, sex workers, men who have sex with men (MSM), transgender people and people living with HIV. In 2019, around a quarter of total new infections occurred among people aged 15–24 years, with 99% of all new HIV infections among young people from key populations and their partners (UNAIDS, 2020). The HIV prevalence amongst YKP is more than or equal to 5% in 10 countries of the region across all young key populations. In particular, the HIV prevalence amongst young MSM and young people who inject drugs is higher than 5% in all 10 countries.

The region has vibrant YKP initiatives led by national and regional YKP networks in partnership with the UN and other technical partners. Numerous advocacy and innovations have been spearheaded, leading to enabling environment for YKP to access the essential services, harness their leadership and reduce stigma and discrimination. Such initiatives, however, are sporadic and are not well spread consistently across countries. Moreover, there still exist huge programmatic, data, funding and policy gaps to address the YKP issues. If we are to reach the 95-95-95 targets and end AIDS by 2030, young key populations must be empowered and meaningfully engaged in decision making to guide an effective HIV response.

As part of a joint regional strategy to continue to advocate for and support the YKP agenda in the region, in 2020 Youth LEAD, UNAIDS AP, UNFPA APRO and UNICEF EAPRO initiated a report to analyze the existing available quantitative data on the HIV situation among YKP, document different regional stakeholders' perspectives and approaches to YKP and collect innovative programs. The report, which is still being developed by the aforementioned partners, will aim at rejuvenating YKP issues and offering solid evidence for continuous advocacy.

The proposed HLM side event will present and discuss the HIV situation among YKPs, groundbreaking programs, lessons learned, and testimonies from young key populations leaders.

Organizer information

Youth LEAD, UNAIDS AP, UNFPA APRO, UNICEF EAPRO and UNDP Bangkok Regional Hub will jointly organize the side event.

Youth LEAD will be the focal agency for the event and will liaise with the UN agencies for the agenda, identifying speakers and other logistical support for the event.
